ID AYU0243) with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and Yearly permission with 20 seats in 04 PG Courses in the subject namely (i) Shalya Tantra-05 seats, (ii) Shalakya Tantra-05 seats, (iii) Kayachikitsa-05 seats, (iv) Panchkarma-05 seats and extended permission with 19 seats(instead of 20 seats) in 04 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhanta-05 seats,(ii) Dravyaguna Vigyana-05 seats, (iii) Rasa Shastra & Bhaishajya Kalpana-05 seats, (iv) Kriya Sharir-04 seats (instead of 05 seats) and 1st Renewal of permission in 02 PG Courses in the subject namely (i) Prasuti & Stree roga-07 seats, (ii) Swasthavrita-07 seats and 2nd Renewal of permission for increase of seats in existing 04 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Shalya Tantra-from 05 to 07 seats, (ii) Shalakya Tantra-from 05 to 10 seats, (opted for Shalakya-Netra Roga Chikitsa-05 seats and Shalakya-Karna, Naasa and Mukha Roga Chikitsa-05 seats), (iii)Kayachikitsa-from 05 to 10 seats, (iv) Panchkarma-from 05 to 10 seats and 2nd Renewal of permission in 01 PG course in the subject namely (i)Kaumarbhritya-Bala Roga-06 seats, for the academic session 2025-26 under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 in respect of 1st appeal dated 12.08.2025-reg.

Sir/Madam,

- 1) This is with reference to the 1st appeal filed by you vide letter **ref. no. PAC/1054 dated 12.08.2025** to the Commission against the order passed by the President, MARBISM vide letter dated 07.08.2025 with regards to issuance of permission with seat Reduction in UG (BAMS) Course and denial of permission in 01 PG course in the department of Kriya Sharir for the Academic year 2025-26.
- 2) Accordingly, an opportunity of hearing was granted to you vide letter dated 19.08.2025 to appear virtually before the designated hearing committee on 20.08.2025 in respect of appeal filed by you.
- 3) The proceeding of appeal was held virtually on 20.08.2025 at 11:00 AM and the representative **Dr. Anil Kumar, Principal and Dr. Arun Pandey, CMO, of the college** has attended the hearing. The hearing committee sought clarification from the college which is as under: -

Appeal & Clarification from the college	Observation of the Hearing Committee	
1. Regarding Bed Occupancy (NCISM Letter Paras 8, 9& 10) In Para 10 of the NCISM letter, after re-examining the hearing committee's observations and our clarifications (Annexure-1-A), the Board applied the Seat Reduction policy 2025-26 and concluded that resulting in a 15-seat reduction in UG intake (from 100 to 85 seats).	College submission can be consider but college should inform commission/MARB-ISM for doing such bed shifting in future and must follow SOP laid by the NCISM/MARB-ISM from time to time.	
Our humble submission:		
• This conclusion was based solely on data from the main teaching hospital (Patanjali Ayurved Hospital, Haridwar) and did not account for inpatients managed at the Patanjali Wellness Centre. Haridwar which functioned as an extension of our teaching hospital during Centre of Excellence renovations

- The Wellness Centre, under a formal Mol (Annexure-III), allocated 100 beds exclusively for academic use. The allocation was requested on 03.02.2024 (Annexure-IV) and approved on 05.02.2024 (Annexure-V).

- Humble Prayer: We most respectfully and humbly request that
 the Patanjali Wellness Centre data be kindly included in the
 2024-25 occupancy calculation, which would raise the average
 occupancy from the recorded 34.81% to 62.70%, thereby,
 fulfilling the regulatory norm that formed the basis for the
 Board's decision in Para 10 and justifying the restoration of the
 UG intake to 100 seats.
- 2. Regarding PG Kriya Sharir Faculty Strength (NCISM Letter Paras 8 & 10) In Para 10, the Board also concluded that under the Seat Reduction Policy 2025-26 and MESAR PG Ayurveda 2024, the Department of Kriya Sharir is ineligible for PG permission due to non-availability of a Professor, which is mandatory as per sub-regulation (1) of regulation Our humble submission:

The vacancy arose when Prof. Dr. Sharad Karande resigned on 08.02.2025 (Annexure-XX). Shortly before Part-1 closure and inspection. Recruitment was initiated immediately, national advertisement published on 07.06.2025 (Annexure-XXI); interviews were conducted, Current strength: Two Associate Professors (Dr. Vivek Singh, Dr. Suman) and Two Assistant

Submission made by the representative can be considered.

Professors (Dr. Bhawana and Dr. Satakshi Chauhan-Table-2 and Annexure-XXI-A, B, C, D, Humble Prayer: We most respectfully and humbly request that 4 PG seats (2 per Associate Professor) in the Department of Kriya Sharir be kindly sanctioned, so as to ensure contempt of the academic programme and optimal utilization of appointing a Professor is completed in full compliance with NCISM norms.

- 4) In view of the above, the hearing committee recommends to consider the appeal filed by the Principal, Patanjali Bhartiya Ayurvigyan Avum Anusandhan Sansthan, Maharishi Dayanand Gram, Delhi-Haridwar Highway, Near Bahadrabad, Haridwar-249405, Uttarakhand (Inst. ID AYU0243), against the impugned order dated 07.08.2025 passed by the MARB-ISM and the recommendation of hearing committee has been accepted by the Chairman, NCISM.
- 5) Further, a letter vide Ref. no. 51-32/2025-26/Comm. Appeal/College (Ayu.) dated 22.08.2025 and an email dated 23.08.2025 has been received from the Secretary, NCISM directing the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM to grant permission to Patanjali Bhartiya Ayurvigyan Avum Anusandhan Sansthan, Maharishi Dayanand Gram, Delhi-Haridwar Highway, Near Bahadrabad, Haridwar-249405, Uttarakhand (Inst. ID AYU0243) with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26 as per concerned act and regulations and to issue permission in Kriya Sharir department as per the available teacher student ratio.

"DECISION"

- 6) Therefore, in view of above, Patanjali Bhartiya Ayurvigyan Avum Anusandhan Sansthan, Maharishi Dayanand Gram, Delhi-Haridwar Highway, Near Bahadrabad, Haridwar-249405, Uttarakhand (Inst. ID AYU0243), is hereby granted with:-
 - a) Yearly Permission in UG (BAMS) course with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 54(3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024 and;
 - b) Yearly permission with 20 seats in 04 PG Courses in the subject namely (i) Shalya Tantra-05 seats, (ii) Shalakya Tantra-05 seats, (iii) Kayachikitsa-05 seats, (iv) Panchkarma- 05 seats and extended permission with 19 seats (instead of 20 seats) in 04 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhanta-05 seats, (ii) Dravyaguna Vigyana-05 seats, (iii) Rasa Shastra & Bhaishajya Kalpana-05 seats, (iv) Kriya Sharir-04 seats (instead of 05 seats) as per the available teacher student ratio for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020,
 - c) 1st Renewal of permission in 02 PG Courses in the subject namely (i) Prasuti & Stree roga-07 seats, (ii) Swasthavrita-07 seats,
 - d) 2nd Renewal of permission for increase of seats in existing 04 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Shalya Tantra-from 05 to 07 seats, (ii) Shalakya Tantra-from 05 to 10 seats, (opted for Shalakya- Netra Roga Chikitsa-05 seats and Shalakya-Karna, Naasa and Mukha Roga Chikitsa-05 seats), (iii) Kayachikitsa-from 05 to 10 seats, (iv) Panchkarma-from 05 to 10 seats,
 - e) 2nd Renewal of permission in 01 PG course in the subject namely (i)Kaumarbhritya-Bala Roga-06 seats, for the academic session 2025-26 under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020
- 7) The aforementioned decision is issued under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that following requirements shall be fulfilled:-
 - (i) It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and minimum 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 76 seats (instead of 77 seats) in 11 PG courses shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
- 8) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations there under.
- 9) Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical

profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.

- 10) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 11) Compliance report of all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the implementation letters vide ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS dated 09.05.2024 and 06.09.2024 issued by the board.
- 12) The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-27:
 - i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - iii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024.
 - iv) All the requirement of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standard of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2022.
- 13) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2025-26.
